

NMTA June 7 & 8 at Edoras

Please carefully read, print this (ideally in color), and take this document with you.

All adults must sign the AMA release AND the minors release to be on property!

General Property Description & Expected Conditions:

Edoras ranges from seven to eight thousand feet in altitude, and is mostly forested. Plan for cold-to-cool mornings and warm-to-hot afternoons. Conditions can be dry or soaked.

Edoras lies long ways east-west across hogback ridges, mountains, and valleys, is 1.6 miles deep from the 'front' in the east, and the 'back' in the west. The front is 1,000 yards wide and has minimal fencing. The mountain ridge to the west is about half way to the back in the property (just left of 'Edoras' below). We ask that everyone stay inside the 'Front Area', which is bounded on the east by fence, on the north by downed barbed wire, on the south near 'Camping' fence, and on the west and southwest by a valley bottom. Do not trespass on adjacent private properties. Don't ride on the county road – use the internal trails.



Wood fires are allowed ONLY one place provided by the host, and only if the conditions favor. Propane warming is allowed but only when well away from fuels. All off highway vehicles must have USFS approved spark arrestors!

Warning! Rural properties and Trials events are inherently dangerous! Risks include, but are not limited to, tripping, slipping, falling, crashing, being contacted by vehicles in or out of control. Always be on guard and aware of your immediate surroundings. Do not venture out alone and always let others know where you plan to go. Inspect where your minors/children will go. Bears, mountain lions, bobcats, skunks, rattle snakes, neighbor's dogs, and other critters have been known to be on property.

MEDICAL

Plan ahead for what YOU will do in case of an emergency.

No professional medical services are provided during NMTA events and there will be none provided by the host on site. 911 responsiveness and response times have not been tested and are not guaranteed. If you have a medical incident or emergency please let the host, event volunteers, or event participants, know.

The closest medical clinic is between La Cueva and Mora on NM 518, about 20 minutes away by the shortest route south on Coyote Road and thus through La Cueva:

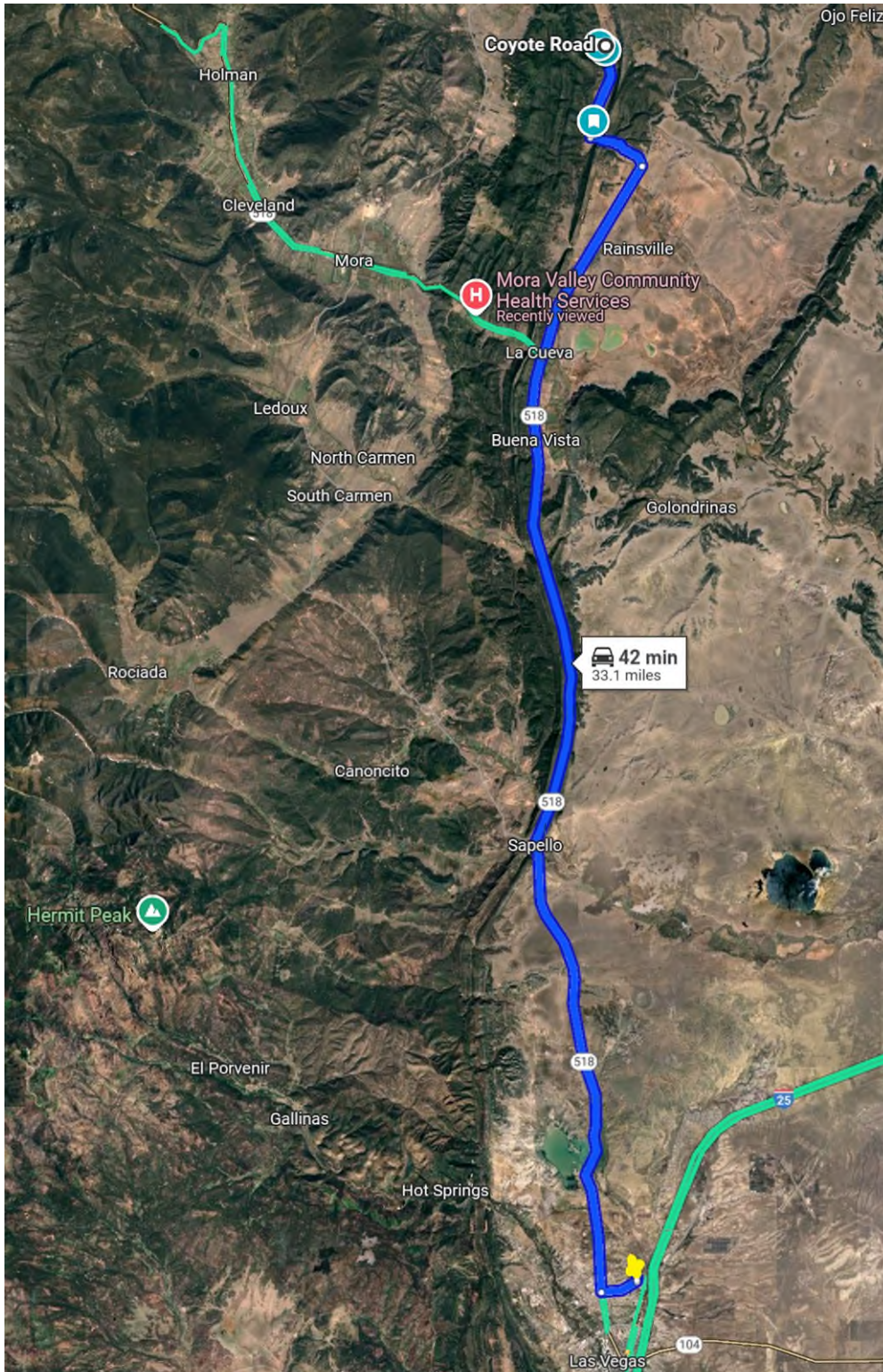

Parking/Camping:

Edoras has very little level ground! Count on significant slopes, **bringing over ample supplies to level your vehicles!** We shall guide you to your camping spot according to the size of your rig and your privacy/peer group preferences. If you are unsure where to go, come in the gate and park off to the side until we can get you situated. We shall squirrel away smaller vehicles in nooks as much as possible to leave as much of the grassy area by the gate for the large vehicles.

Internet and Cellular:

The front area close to the county roads tends to have only one bar of 4G, which is slow and intermittent, and can 'step on' the MUCH faster 3G from a nearby tower to the northwest. When you have the 3G, make good use of it! Cell coverage will of course depend on which cellular plan. At the grid power meter pole we have wifi from local fiber optic internet. This will support only a limited number of users so we will be limiting access to it.

Electric, Water & Septic:

Camping is primitive, no hookups. If I can hook the new well to a generator in time there might be water available. There is no septic available, and grid power is limited to the host's family trailers.

*Dogs: **Leash Rule!***

We are definitely pet friendly, but leash rules apply when you are away from your camper with your pet(s) and always if your pooch is inclined to roam around and piss on tires and get into fights 😊

Local Supplies:

Restaurants – Razz Café (when open - La Cueva); Theresa's Tomales (Mora); Rene's 50s Diner (Mora); a Mom n' Pop food place in Los de Mora Grower's Cooperative (Mora)

Fuel and Tires/repair – Auto Care Tires & Repair (Mora); Allsup's (Mora)

Groceries - Los de Mora Grower's Cooperative (Mora)

Auto Parts – NAPA (after Mora toward Holman); Parts Plus (Mora)

Otherwise, Las Vegas has pretty much everything.

GPS Directions to Edoras - Mora County, New Mexico

Enter the following gate location decimal GPS coordinates exactly as shown below into the Google Maps search bar, then select Directions. Check for the correct GPS location before you set out. Loading the map in memory will allow you to navigate during weak/absent cell signal. Destination contacts: Chris at (five eight zero) nine 1 nine three 2 4 one; Claire at (5 eight zero) 9 one 9 three 2 7 one.

TEXT Directions to Edoras – Mora County, New Mexico

Edoras is in the 'Mora Hogbacks', 8 crow-fly miles NE of Mora, NM

- ***From the south via I-25 northbound*** (the most common route for NMTA members):
Exit 347, northern Las Vegas, NM left/southwest to the Comfort Inn & Maverik C-store.
Take Legion drive westward 1.1 miles to NM 518 (Walmart across from the intersection).
Go right/north 23 miles on NM 518 to the adobe mill and rock walls of La Cueva
Go right/north on NM 442 for 5.2 miles to Mora County A021/Lucero Road (gravel).
Go left/west on Lucero Road for 1.6 miles to and through Lucero (a yard with old buildings).
In Lucero, A021 jogs right/north becoming Coyote Road.
From Lucero, go north on Coyote Road 2.3 miles to the Edoras South gate.

- ***From the north via I-25 southbound:***
Exit 387 Wagon Mound going right/west on NM 120 for 23.4 miles to Ocate (a dinky town).
Go left/south at the T intersection onto NM 442
On NM 442, go 16.3 miles to Mora County A021/Lucero Road (gravel).
Go right/west on Lucero Road for 1.6 miles to and through Lucero (a yard with old buildings).
In Lucero, A021 jogs right/north becoming Coyote Road.
From Lucero, go north on Coyote Road 2.3 miles to the Edoras South gate.

- ***From the north through Angel Fire on NM 434 southbound:***
Take NM 434 south for 8.2 miles south to T right to stay on NM 434 and avoid NM 120.
Go 16.1 miles then T left/east onto gravel Mora County A022.
On A022 go 1.4 miles to gravel T intersection A021 Coyote Road
Go right/south on A021 Coyote Road for 1.9 miles to the Edoras South gate.
Note: 12 to 14 miles south of Angel Fire NM 434 has road construction, sometime with traffic light wait-times with a few twisty and narrow segments.

- ***From the west through Mora on NM 518*** you'll have two route choices:

1. Continuing east on NM 518 for 5.3 miles to the adobe mill and rock walls of La Cueva.
Go left/north on NM 442 for 5.2 miles to Mora County A021/Lucero Road (gravel).
Go left/west on Lucero Road for 1.6 miles to and through Lucero (a yard with old buildings).
In Lucero, A021 jogs right/north becoming Coyote Road.
From Lucero, go north on Coyote Road 2.3 miles to the Edoras South gate.

2. Left/north in Mora onto NM 434 for 9.7 miles to gravel T intersection Mora County A022.
(Note the turn onto NM 434 in Mora is narrow, between buildings).
Go right/east on A022 for 1.4 miles to the gravel T intersection with A021 Coyote Road.
Go right/south on A021 Coyote Road for 1.9 miles to the Edoras South gate.
